	Van Biesel	August 23, 2021 NPU-F meeting: Emory presented their proposal. DHCA presented the DHCA Position Statement and motion. NPU-F committee requested that DHCA clearly state motion and conditions. NPU-F recommended that DHCA withdraw the motion and work with Emory collaboratively to address concerns. Additional meetings were held with Emory, DeKalb Schools, and working committee; requests of the organizations were reviewed.
